Your audio guide:

Thanks very much for choosing this mp3cityguides guide to Nice. If you've already done any of our other walks, you'll know how it works but if not, I'll tell you now.

As you've probably already noticed, each of the sections of the walk that you've downloaded on to your machine has a name - this first one is 'Negresco/Promenade des Anglais'. Just consider each of these walks as individual tracks on an 'album' which is the complete tour of Nice. You'll hear directions about where to go next at the end of each section but the route and the stopping points are also marked on your map which is on page four of this Printed Guide.

When you get to a stopping point find somewhere to stand or sit which is out of the way of people and traffic and then play the relevant section of the walk.

The map has been especially produced to help you find your way while you're listening to the audio guide which means that it's not drawn exactly to scale.

Top tip: when you print out this Printed Guide or, at least, the map, set your printer to high quality or fine print so that the map is as clear as possible and easy to read.

Please take care when you're using the audio guide: Nice is a relatively safe city but do keep an eye out for pick pockets and watch out when you're crossing the road.

When we arrive at a monument, church or a museum, after I've described it you might want to go inside or you might want to buy a ticket for later if it looks crowded. Or you might just want to carry on and come back and visit it afterwards now that you know where it is.

Top tip: Play a few sections of the tour on your mp3 player or iPod before you go just to check that they've downloaded properly.

Your printed guide:

This printed guide complements your audio guide. We know that exploring a city can take more than one visit - and possibly even a life time - so we've pared our guide down to what we think are the essential things to see and do. They're included in section four, the Hit List.



3.0 - GETTING AROUND

From Nice-Côte d'Azur airport:

By taxi: This is the easiest option. There are taxis outside both terminals. The journey takes about 15 to 30 minutes depending on traffic to the centre of town and costs about €25-35 (about £20-30).

Bus The number 98 bus operated by Ligne d'Azur departs from both terminals every day from 6.50am – 7.40pm and stops regularly as it goes along the Promenade des Anglais, through the new town and then up to the Port. The price is €6 (about £5) per person for a single ticket.

From Nice Ville station:

There are taxis and buses outside the station. A journey within Nice itself should cost no more than €30 (about £25). Make sure that the meter is running before you set off.

Getting around:

Bus Nice's buses are reasonably efficient, cheap and safe although they do stop regular services around 8.30pm. Noctambus services run later – check timetables at bus stops.

Buy your ticket on the bus for €1 for a single journey and insert it into the machine to validate it. You can buy up to 10 tickets at a time. You can the use same ticket to change onto another route, within a maximum time period of 74 minutes. Return trips or a second onward journey on the same route are will require another ticket.

Taxi Nice's taxis are relatively expensive and scarce. There are taxi ranks outside Nice Ville railway station, by the Jardin Albert Premier at the Meridian Hotel, in the Place Garibaldi and outside the Negresco Hotel. To ring a taxi: + 33 4 93 88 25 82. They normally arrive within about 15 minutes.

Tram Nice's smart new tram system is mainly for commuters but line one goes from the Nice Ville railway station to the Gare Routière (bus station) near the Old Town. Tickets are the same as those for the bus but must be bought before boarding and, again validated on board.

4.0 - THE HIT LIST

Getting to know Nice – or any historic city – can take a lifetime but if you've only got a weekend here is what we recommend you see in descending order of priority.

Musée Matisse – Matisse Museum Set in a 19th century villa, this spacious gallery tells the story of the artist's life and his artistic development. While you're there look out for the Roman ruins (see next entry) and the beautiful gardens of the Cimiez monastery over to the left as you face the entrance of the Matisse Museum. Musée Achéologique Nice-Cemenelum – Archaeological Museum This well laid out museum has artefacts and antiquities dating from about 1000BC until the middle ages. * Musée Masséna Recently refurbished, this museum has sumptuous state rooms on the ground floor and then two storeys showing the history of Nice from the seventeenth century onwards. Paintings of the town as a quiet fishing port with a wooded track called the Promenade des Anglais and the jolly early twentieth century posters are highlights. The shady garden is also lovely. Open: Daily expect Tuesday 10am – 6pm.

Musée des Beaux-Arts – Fine Arts Museum Formerly owned by a Ukrainian princess and an American millionaire, this elegant villa now houses works by painters such as Dufy, Bonnard and Sisley as well as sculptures by Rodin. Open: Daily except Monday.

Musée Chagall – Chagall Museum The great Russian primitive artist, known for his exuberant style and imaginative use of colour was drawn to Nice for the light and created this dramatic exhibition space for a series of works centred on Biblical themes. Cathédrale Orthodoxe Russe Saint-Nicolas – Russian Orthodox Church This stunningly beautiful orthodox Russian church, one of the most lavishly decorated outside Russia, was built by the dowager Russian Empress Alexandra Feodorovna in the middle of the nineteenth century in memory of her son who died in Nice.
