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## Colonial Legends

The island of Cozumel, land of the Swallows, is the first place Europeans encountered the Maya civilization. That encounter, in 1519, was the beginning of massive changes that would sweep through the Americas over the next 500 years. Nowhere would those changes be felt more than here on Cozumel. With each consecutive wave of change, the island and its people have adapted. The island has recently become a refuge for tourists, thanks to underwater enthusiast, Jacques Cousteau. But, in a way, the island has always served as a refuge - to the Maya, pirates, and for those caught up in the Caste War. The persistence of Cozumel's inhabitants is an inspiring story of the human spirit.


